OVERVIEW OF YOUR CO-OP DEGREE

In Arts & Science Co-op, you'll follow one of the following options leading to a four-year degree, comprised of 20 credits:

- Specialist Co-op program
- Double Major program (with one Major in a co-op area)
- or a Major Co-op program with two minors

In addition to completing the academic component of your degree (20 credits), you'll complete at least four co-op courses and spend 8 to 12 months working – called co-op work terms – that are relevant to your program of study.

Preparation Courses: COPB50 and COPB51

Job Search Courses: COPB52, COPC98, and COPC99 (for 3 work term programs)

Work Term Courses: course codes depend on program of study

For most programs, you'll follow the same academic program of requirements as your non-co-op peers. However, some programs have specific additional course and timing requirements that are outlined in [the Academic Calendar](#).

YOUR FIRST YEAR IN CO-OP

1. Attend Orientation and Participate in the Arts & Science Co-op Portal

Once the academic year starts in September, you will gain access to the Arts & Science Co-op Portal on Quercus. It hosts a suite of orientation materials that outline tools, resources and additional information that you require as you embark on your journey with us through first year and beyond. In September, we will also have our Co-op Orientation, stay tuned for more details!

2. Take Your Co-op Preparation Courses: COPB50 and COPB51

In your first year you should complete both COPB50 and COPB51. These courses are offered in the Fall, Winter, and Summer semesters. Read more about this course in the [Academic Calendar](#). Read more about course enrolment for co-op courses [here](#).

3. Select Your Co-op Work Term Sequence

Your work term sequence is essentially a map of when your two or three work terms and academic requirements will be completed. Work Term Sequences are selected during the Fall semester, and are set based on: your program of study, when you were admitted into the co-op program, your co-op program requirements, and the minimum number of work terms required for your program of study. Depending on your program, you'll begin work after you complete three, four or five study terms. Once work terms begin, they normally alternate with study terms until they've all been completed.

Prior to selecting your work term sequence, you will need to complete a sequence module in Quercus or attend a seminar. Look out for more details at Orientation in September.

4. Complete Your Work Term Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for your first work term, you will need to complete your Work Term Eligibility Requirements. [Learn more about these requirements here](#) and ensure that you fulfill all requirements prior to your first work term, so that you will be eligible to compete for your work term.

Requirements include the following:

- Choosing your Co-op Subject POSt (after completion of 4.0 credits)
- Maintaining a cGPA of 2.5
- Completion of certain # of credits (depends on academic program)
- Completion of certain academic courses (depends on academic program)
- Obtaining a Co-op Work Permit (for international students only)

5. Obtain a Co-op Work Permit (for international students only)

International students should apply for a co-op work permit when you are getting your study permit. Our International Student Centre can assist you if you have questions.
