CTL's New Professional Development Course for Faculty

CTL is piloting an eight-month professional development course, **Exploring Best Practices in Teaching and Learning**, to help UTSC faculty and instructors engage deeply with pedagogical best practices across many topics. The course will provide a sense of the broader pedagogical literature and offer a space for critical discussion about how best practices affect our students, teaching contexts and environments. It will run between September 2021 and April 2022. Applications are being accepted from Thursday, July 1 to Friday, July 16.
