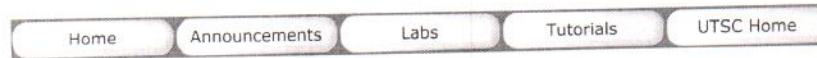

**Medical note form to be completed by the doctor.**

The medical note should:

- verify that the student was examined on the day of the test
- if possible, state the illness and
- it **MUST** indicate the physician's professional opinion as to whether the student should receive special consideration on medical grounds.
